

PE and Sport Funding

The government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum until 2016 to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in schools. This funding, provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport must be used to improve the provision of PE and school sport.

At St Crispin's Infant School we believe PE and School Sports play an important role in the development of our pupils, including impacting on their health and well being. Through participation, our children build and learn more about our key values; enthusiasm for learning, kindness, awareness of right and wrong, creativity and respect. We have developed an innovative, varied PE curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities which we believe have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of all our children.

Having researched how best to spend this money for 2014 – 2015 and 2015 - 2016 to ensure it has a long-lasting impact, we have decided to spend the £9,355 sport premium funding to support the development of PE and school sport in the following ways:

- Renew 'PASSPORT' provision to ensure we have access to network meetings and competitions.
- Develop the joint PE leader to ensure that leadership and management for PE and School Sports is effective and strategic.
- Continue to develop and train staff in the Early Years Foundation Stage; developing knowledge and skills for teaching fundamental movement skills.
- As a whole staff, develop and refine the assessment system for all subjects including PE.
- Widen our community links to promote inter competition with other schools.
- Provide coaching opportunities through external coaches to enhance skills, knowledge and creativity.
- Target reluctant participants in PE, through a bespoke intervention programme.

Our overall aim is to raise standards in PE, School Sport and health awareness, in order to bring about a lasting impact on our children. We aim to provide higher quality lessons and improved learning using PE as a vehicle to whole school improvement in Literacy and Numeracy.
