



PE and Sport Premium

The government has announced that it is continuing to provide additional funding to improve the provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding, provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport must be used to improve the provision of PE and school sport.

At St Crispin's Infant School we believe PE and Sports play an important role in the development of our pupils, including impacting on their health and well being. Through participation, our children build and learn more about our key values; enthusiasm for learning, kindness, awareness of right and wrong, creativity and respect. We have developed an innovative, varied PE curriculum as well as extra-curricular opportunities which we believe have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of all our children.

The Department for Education (DfE) guidelines on the Primary PE and Sport Premium state that schools should be using this funding to create '*sustainable improvement*'. Our main focus this year will be to address deficits in pupils' social and emotional wellbeing, physical health (obesity) and resilience, thus improving learning behaviour and self - esteem.

Having researched how best to spend this money for 2017 – 2018 using our assessment data (2016 – 2017) and to ensure it has a long-lasting impact, we have decided to spend the £17,780 sport premium funding to support the development of PE and school sport in the following ways:

- Renew 'PASSPORT' provision to ensure we have access to network meetings and competitions.
 - Continue to develop and train staff to ensure all PE lessons are high quality, especially new staff.
 - Track PE attainment closely to ensure progress is being made.
- Continue to widen our community links to promote inter competition and festivals with other schools.
- Train staff in dance and ensure lessons are appealing to all genders.
- Employ two Active Play Leaders to organise active play linked to our SDP priorities and address physical activity during unstructured times.
- Employ a lunch time play leader to organise active play and model good practice to others.

Our overall aim is to raise standards in PE, School Sport and health awareness, in order to bring about a lasting impact on our children. We aim to provide higher quality lessons and improved learning using PE as a vehicle to whole school improvement in Literacy and Numeracy.
